The U.S. Census Bureau to Resume Some 2020 Census Field Operations in Select Locations

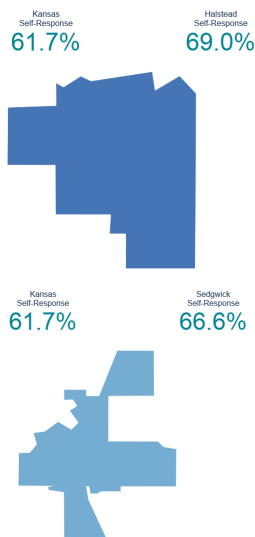
Area Census Offices (ACOs) will restart operations, resuming Update Leave (UL) field operations and completing the hiring process for Nonresponse Followup (NRFU) field staff. As soon as it is safe to do so, more ACOs will also resume activities. As of May 4, the ACOs below will resume operations:

- MT: Billings
- ND: Bismarck
- OK: Cleveland County, Oklahoma County, and Tulsa
- UT: Orem and Salt Lake City

As part of the phased restart, the census will resume Update Leave, where the Census Bureau drops off 2020 Census invitation packets at front doors of households in areas where the majority of households do not receive mail at their home. Update Leave does not require interaction between households and a Census Bureau employee and follows the most current federal health and safety guidelines. Learn more [here](#).

2020 Census Partner Highlight

On April 14 the City of Sedgwick, Kansas challenged the City of Halstead, Kansas to a friendly competition to see which City can achieve the highest self-response percentage rate. The City of Halstead has remained in the lead throughout the competition, but the City of Sedgwick is closing the gap daily. This challenge helped the CCC's promote the Census in both cities, as well as, Harvey County.



Response Rate Fun Facts

- Kansas had the ninth highest cumulative total self-response rate in the nation with 61.7 percent, behind Minnesota (67.4), Wisconsin (64.8), Iowa (64.4), Nebraska (63.9), Michigan (63.5), Washington (62.2), Illinois (62.0), and Ohio (61.9)
- Kingman County, Kansas had the highest daily total self-response rate in the State with 0.9 percent, followed by Decatur County, Kansas with 0.8 percent (Harvey County, Kansas is at 0.2 percent)
- Harvey County, Kansas had a cumulative Internet self-response rate at 0.1 percent
- Halstead, Kansas had the fifty-third highest cumulative total self response rate in the state with 69.0 percent
- Sedgwick, Kansas had the seventy-seventh highest cumulative total self response rate in the state with 66.6 percent
